Home Safety Tips:

* * Weatherization * *

With winter fast approaching, mid-fall is the perfect time to get your home ready for colder temperatures. Adding insulation to walls and ceilings helps keep warmth inside, while checking and sealing ductwork in unheated spaces can prevent significant heat loss and reduce energy bills. A well-insulated home stays more comfortable and efficient throughout the season.

Windows and doors are also key areas to prepare before winter sets in. Replace or seal older, drafty windows, install storm doors, and use caulk or weather-stripping to keep cold air out. Take advantage of sunny days by opening drapes to let in warmth and close them at night to retain it. These small weatherization steps can make a big difference in comfort and savings all winter long.

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HOUSE/BUILDING NUMBERS NOTICE | ORDINANCE 2023-10

Peru Residents,

Please make sure that your home or business has its proper building numbers installed outside in accordance with Ordinance No. 2023-10. This is in an effort to assist emergency personnel in identifying properties in an emergency and for other safety purposes. Numbers need to be clearly visible from the street and follow the city ordinance. You can find the criteria below.

CRITERIA: Numbers/Letters:

- Numbers must be visible from the street.
- Numbers should be on the home/building and mailbox if applicable. Numbers on pedestal signs are also acceptable.
- Numbers must contrast the color of the home/building.
- Numbers should be a minimum of 3" or larger.
- Numbers or letters should be assigned to individual apartment doors or separate residences.

Buildings that were not in compliance received a letter earlier this month. Please bring your building up to compliance if you have not already done so. The city plans to begin enforcing this ordinance in November. If you have any questions, please contact City Hall.

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2026 PET LICENSE RENEWAL | ORDINANCE NO. 2023-14

Attention Dog and Cat Owners,

The time is fast approaching for you to renew your pet licenses with the City! Any owner of a dog or cat over the age of six months needs to be licensed with the city annually or before January 1st of each year. Now is the time for you to make sure that your pets are up to date on their vaccinations before renewing your license! You can renew your license starting in December of this year for 2026. 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SNOW EMERGENCIES NOTICE | ORDINANCE NO. 2025-01

Peru Residents.

As winter fast approaches, the city is reminding residents of our snow emergency procedure under Ordinance No. 2025-01. If a snow fall of 2 inches or higher is forecasted, the Mayor may declare a snow emergency. Please keep an eye on the city's website or our facebook page for any snow emergency notices.

If a snow emergency is declared, <u>all vehicles must be moved off of any city highway or street</u>. Vehicles may be towed at owners expense if you fail to move them. This is to ensure that the streets are safe and can be plowed/treated by the city when the snow arrives.

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
