

# PERU FLOOD RESPONSE REPORT

August 23, 2019

In an effort to improve timely communication between the City of Peru and its community members, the following provides updates on several important flood response concerns and comes to you from Mayor Darrin Reeves:

- **Portable Water Plant** – After final processing adjustments, the boil order was lifted on Monday, August 12. Residents may now drink the water in Peru and normal water use is permissible with the exception of lawn watering, swimming pools, etc. With the arrival of students on the Peru State College campus, the City is pleased that the portable plant is providing sufficient potable water supply to meet the demands.
- **The City is working with FEMA on projects that will provide funding for the following:**
  - Wastewater Treatment Lagoons
  - Portable Water Treatment Plant
  - Olive Street Bridge – Trailhead and City Compost
  - Debris Removal
  - City Roads

Note: These are important projects as the City of Peru plans for long-term recovery.

- **Community Meals & Flood Supply Distribution** – Peru Community Impact Group (PCIG) will continue to offer free community meals at City Hall on the 2<sup>nd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Sundays of the month, 5:00-7:00 p.m. Flood supply distribution will also continue on the 2<sup>nd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Sundays, while supplies last.
